Fr Benjamin writes...

There are some institutions in the world which have strict entry requirements: universities, guilds, clubs and so many more. Notable for its absence in that prestigious list is the Holy Catholic Church. Entry requirements for belonging to the Body of Christ are comparatively 'low bar'. All one needs is to be baptised and, as the saying goes, 'once a Catholic always a Catholic'. This is not so for the Kingdom of God as Our Blessed Lord tells us in this Sunday's Gospel. The requirements for entering God's Presence, or the Beatific Vision, as many call it, are strict, or as the Lord puts it, like going through a narrow door.

"Are few to be saved?" someone asks Our Blessed Lord. The Lord does not directly answer the question, but simply says the opportunity to enter heaven is available to all, but it is not just a matter of having a casual faith, turning up to Mass now and then, being confirmed and saying a prayer when we need something. It takes commitment, it takes love.

The commitment Our Blessed Lord expects from each one of us who call themselves His disciple should mirror His own commitment, the commitment of the Cross. When God gave us His Son, He did not do so begrudgingly or half-heartedly, but with the full force of the Eternal Father's love. He was born for us, He lived for us, and He died for us. In this way He opened the door to heaven, wide in its welcome, but narrow in that we cannot casually walk in. We need to concentrate, we need to put heart into our Catholic faith, and the 'high bar' requirement is our love. Perhaps the question at the door will be the one St Peter was asked: "Do you love Me?"

And they shall bring all your brothers from all the nations as an offering to the Lord, on horses and in chariots and in litters and on mules and on dromedaries, to my holy mountain Jerusalem,' says the Lord, 'just as the Israelites bring their grain offering in a clean vessel to the house of the Lord. And some of them also I will take for priests and for Levites,' says the Lord.

Go into all the world and proclaim the good news.

Second reading Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

'The Lord disciplines the one he loves.'

Brothers and Sisters: Have you forgotten the exhortation that addresses you as sons? 'My son, do not regard lightly the discipline of the Lord, nor be weary when reproved by him. For the Lord disciplines the one he loves, and chastises every son whom he receives.' It is for discipline that you have to endure. God is treating you as sons. For what son is there whom his father does not discipline? For the moment all discipline seems painful rather than pleasant, but later it yields the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who have been trained by it.

Therefore lift your drooping hands and strengthen your weak knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be put out of joint but rather be healed.

Gospel Luke 13:22-30

'People will come from east and west, and recline at table in the kingdom of God.'

At that time: Jesus went on his way through towns and villages, teaching and journeying towards Jerusalem. And someone said to him, 'Lord, will those who are saved be few?' And he said to them, 'Strive to enter through the narrow door. For many, I tell you, will seek to enter and will not be able. When once the master of the house has risen and shut the door, and you begin to stand outside and to knock at the door, saying, "Lord, open to us", then he will answer you, "I do not know where you come from." Then you will begin to say, "We ate and drank in your presence, and you taught in our streets." But he will say, "I tell you, I do not know where you come from. Depart from me, all you workers of evil!" In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when you see Abraham and Isaac and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God but you yourselves cast out. And people will come from east and west, and from north and south, and recline at table in the kingdom of God. And behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last.'



RIGHT TO LIFE—WRITE TO THE LORDS

The Crime and Policing Bill has passed to the House of Lords for debate. The clause on decriminalising abortion is now Clause 191 of the Crime and Policing Bill. Peers will debate Clause 191 and can suggest changes to it – or even to reject it altogether.

Please write to members of the House of Lords asking them to fight the extreme abortion up to birth amendment. This was not in any manifesto. It was passed after just 43 minutes backbench debate, with very little notice. This online tool <u>Fight the latest attempts to decriminalise abortion - SPUC</u> will generate a Peer at random for you to write to, and give an editable template. Once you have finished your letter, it will be emailed to you to print off and send to the Peer by post. This is an extra step to what you might be used to, but a very necessary one. Paper letters always have more impact than emails, and many Peers do not have publicly available email addresses. Please send the physical letter to Members of the House of Lords (or return them to the office to post for you). Please continue to pray hard. Thank you
