## **30 November 2025**

#### Fr Benjamin writes ...

There are many key words to the season of Advent: Second Coming, preparation, expectation, and many more. Procrastination is not one of them. As a procrastinator myself, by inclination, Advent is a very good remedy. This is not about leaving the washing up until tomorrow, or making that dreaded dentist's appointment next week rather than now; no, this is far more serious, because the urgency is all the greater. This is about making our souls ready. Ready for what? Ready for God Who, as He says in today's Gospel of the First Sunday of Advent, "is coming at an hour you do not expect."

So, therefore, what if there is something on our conscience weighing on our soul? We cannot say, 'I will confess it next month'. What if the Lord comes next week requiring an account from us as to how we have been looking after the beautiful soul He created for us? I'm not sure how He would respond to the answer, 'I was going to sort it out next week, when I would be less busy.'

The Lord reminds His listeners of people being so busy they forget God. This is the crux of the problem. Busyness is not necessarily an excuse, but a reason for potentially allowing God to slip into the shadows and out of consciousness. Noah was not too busy for God; Noah kept God in his heart, and so lived through the great flood.

This Advent-tide is given to us as a gift to keep our souls in readiness for God in whatever way He comes – through the sacraments, through people, and yes, at the End Times. Use this time wisely and promptly to make or keep your soul in readiness for God so that, when He comes, He may find you awake and alert.

## The Lord gathers all nations together into the eternal peace of the Kingdom of God.

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, and many peoples shall come, and say:

'Come, let us go up to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.'

For out of Sion shall go forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarrelling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ.

## Stay awake so that you may be ready.

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples: 'For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark, and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left. Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left. Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into. Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.'
