Fr Benjamin writes ...

It's always exciting to receive an invitation, particularly to something like a wedding. It's always helpful to the one extending the invitation to receive a reply. Whilst Our Blessed Lord doesn't need to know numbers for seating arrangements, He does expect a response. In fact, the parable goes further than that by saying He expects not only a reply but a 'yes'. Surely, we should have the freedom to say no? Indeed, we do, and God respects that freedom, but the point Our Blessed Lord is making is that if we knew the kind of feast to which were being invited then we would never say no. He is inviting us to His Father's House to feast on His love for eternity. This is in complete contrast to the everyday things which preoccupy us: preparing meals, doing business and other earthly things. These things are important and have their place, but they are mere distractions compared to the reality of God's generous offer of His love and life.

How often are we so distracted that we forget we are invited to the greatest feast of eternity? Are there times we would prefer to go to the supermarket, to the football or watch the television, rather than witness the Mass and the Lord Himself held up above the Altar ready to give Himself for us? The Lord wants what is best for us and so He is saying this week that "You really should go" if you want the best. To opt for second best is to shortchange ourselves and to miss out on something that is out of this world.


Invite everyone you can to the wedding

Jesus began to speak to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." For many are called, but few are chosen.'
