# Fr Benjamin writes ...

There are times in life when we ask, "Why me?" It may be in either a positive or negative context: "Why have I been chosen to do this task?" or "Why has this happened to me?"

The Samaritan woman at the Well could very easily have asked such a question — "Why has He come to me?" Alone, and minding her own business, this stranger approaches her asking her for a drink of water. Before she knows it, He is telling her all her life details and that God is thirsting for her faith. Her life changes at this moment, and she has entered into a new existence, the life of faith and awareness that in Christ, Whom she now calls "Saviour", the Presence of God is very near. "Why has this happened to me?" she may have asked. I know I would — I often do.

When it comes to the words and actions of Our Blessed Lord, nothing is an accident. No conversation is idle, no approach mere chance. When Christ went to speak to this woman by the Well, He had a plan for her and, indeed for all the Samaritans who also came to faith through her testimony. His whole encounter with this ostracised and complex person was for her good and the good of those around her. He showed her the truth of Who He is, the truth of Who God is, and it was now for her to tell others.

Every time we hear the words of the Gospel, and the words spoken by Our Blessed Lord, we are hearing the words of God through a human mouth, and they are words spoken to each one of us deliberately and with the same individual concern and saving intent. They are also words which seek to transform our lives into being children of the new existence that is the Kingdom of God, which cannot be kept to ourselves. Each of us is chosen in some way to bear testimony to the new life we encounter when we meet Christ. Each one of us has met the Lord, in whatever way and for whatever reason, in order to leave former ways behind (the still, stagnant waters of the Well), and embrace the living waters of Baptism so that all others around us may be refreshed. When you next hear the Word of God and encounter Him in prayer, you may ask, "Why me?" because there will undoubtedly be a reason.

# The Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

Gospel John 11:3-7,17,20-27,33-45

#### I am the resurrection and the life

Mary and Martha sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.' Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.'

Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus wept; and the Jews said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.' Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.
