Fr Benjamin writes...

"Will you please get on!" my mother would plead, as my five siblings and I would bicker over the dinner table. It was not only at dinner, but at other occasions. She would always urge us to be good to one another, especially if she knew we were spending time with one another. She knew there was room for co-operation, argument, support and competition. To her last days, she would urge us to look after one another.

I wonder if Our Blessed Lord is on a similar wavelength when He urges His disciples, the night before He died, "Love one another; just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another". He knew them through and through, and He was aware that they had tendencies to be in competition with each other ("Who will be the greatest in the Kingdom of heaven?"); that they could vie with one another to be closest to Him ("Who will sit on your left and on your right?"), and also to harbour jealousies. If the Church was to flourish, this would all have to stop, and they would have to love one another, not in their own ways, but in the Lord's way – "just as I have loved you".

That love, of course, is the love of complete and unconditional self-giving for the good of all. The wonderful thing about this is that, if everyone does so, everyone is loved. With the Divine love, no one is excluded, and everyone is embraced. This is why Our Lord calls His exhortation a Commandment which, rather than being an order is God's way of guiding us to be happy and completely living in his Image.

It is a command extended to all of us, in our families, in our parish, our diocese and the universal Church. There is no excuse for the bickering and division in which we can find ourselves, but Our Blessed Lord also knows us through and through, and so still addresses us with His New Commandment; that we truly love one other.

And when they arrived and gathered the church together, they declared all that God had done with them, and how he had opened a door of faith to the Gentiles.
