

ALL SAINTS 21st Sunday after Pentecost 2 November 2025

Fr Benjamin writes ...

It is well known in the Parish that if someone says to me, "I'm only human" when trying to excuse some transgression or error, a kindly look of exasperation will cross my face. This will be followed by a brief lesson on why this is not a Christian excuse. Why? Because to be human is to be the highest of all God's creation. Made in the Image and Likeness of God, our being is so precious to Him that He became one of us in order to save us and make us even more special in the future.

Our Blessed Lord is, as St Paul says, the "image of the invisible God". He is what it is to be truly human, to be the perfect reflection of what God in human form is like. If we ever transgress, sin, or err, it is not because we are human, but because we are not human enough.

That may sound a harsh thing to say, but it is purely biblical in its reasoning. When we get things wrong or do anything that is not of God, we do not become less human in the sense of being dehumanised, but a damaged form of the perfect human, Our Lord Jesus Christ. The phrase "to err is human, to forgive is Divine" is only half true, because in the Christian sense, the more like the Divine we become, so too we become more authentically human.

This is the core meaning of sainthood, or sanctity, which is to choose to live in such way that our lives clearly reflect Our Lord Jesus Christ's life on earth. For Christ, the central aspect of His human identity was His love and obedience of the Father. The more we learn of God and His holy Will, and the more we choose to follow it, the more we resemble the Son of God. This is not just through the large gestures of self-giving, but the everyday offering of self and tasks to God and neighbour, for God's glory and their good.

If someone says, "I'm only human" tell them of the perfect human being Who walked on earth 2000 years ago.

After this I looked, and behold, a great multitude that no one could number, from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages, standing before the throne and before the Lamb, clothed in white robes, with palm branches in their hands, and crying out with a loud voice, 'Salvation belongs to our God who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb!' And all the angels were standing round the throne and round the elders and the four living creatures, and they fell on their faces before the throne and worshipped God, saying, 'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honour and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen.'

Then one of the elders addressed me, saying, 'Who are these, clothed in white robes, and from where have they come?' I said to him, 'Sir, you know.' And he said to me, 'These are the ones coming out of the great tribulation. They have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.'

Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth. Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied. Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven.'
