## ORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE(OF) 24th & Last Sunday after Pentecost (EF)

#### **21 November 2025**

#### Fr Benjamin writes ...

We all know that Christ is our king. We know He is the King of kings. Yet, in today's Gospel we see Him hung upon the Cross, being offered sour wine. This is not regal treatment. We would not treat our worst enemies in such a shameful way. We certainly should not treat our God in this way.

Kings had a bad reputation two thousand years ago. Look at the two Herods. Each was a power-hungry, glory-seeking despot with no thought for the people they governed other than the taxes and labour they could extract from them. All they did was take and consume.

Today we celebrate and give thanks to another kind of King, a King Who never takes but always gives. He gives Himself to us on the Cross. He gives us His Body and Blood. He is a King Who gives Himself to His people as Bridegroom to a beloved Bride. He feeds us as a loving mother feeds her infant. He gives and never takes.

What do we give Him in return? We can never give in like kind, but we can try with all our hearts. Do we give Him only the sour wine of our sins and lip service, waiting to see Him perform for us. Or do we give Him the best wine of our love and service, thanking Him for Him gift to us, the gift of Himself, the servant King?

And he is before all things, and in him all things hold together. And he is the head of the body, the Church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in everything he might be pre-eminent. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, making peace by the blood of his cross.

Gospel Luke 23:35-43


#### 'Lord, remember me when you come into your kingdom.'

At that time: The rulers scoffed at Jesus, saying, 'He saved others; let him save himself, if he is the Christ of God, his Chosen One!' The soldiers also mocked him, coming up and offering him sour wine and saying, 'If you are the King of the Jews, save yourself!' There was also an inscription over him, 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals who were hanged there railed at Jesus, saying, 'Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us!' But the other rebuked him, saying, 'Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? And we indeed justly, for we are receiving the due reward of our deeds; but this man has done nothing wrong.' And he said, 'Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom.' And he said to him, 'Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in paradise.'
