Fr Benjamin writes...

Being quite a private person, the prospect of inviting everyone from the highways and by-ways for dinner at my house would not be very appealing. Don't get me wrong, I do love to welcome people, but the open-house policy Our Blessed Lord seems to ask for in His parable this Sunday would certainly take many people out of their comfort zones — which is the whole point of the parable.

As Our Lord says on many occasions, it is easy to love those whom we know and like. It is easy to be generous to our friends and those whom we know and trust. In other words, it is easier to love when it is comfortable to do so. The Kingdom of God, however, is greater than that and involves more than ease in relationships, it involves sacrifice. It is about the giving of ourselves without any hope of reward except in knowing that we are living as God lives.

When Our Lord speaks of inviting in "the crippled, the blind and the lame", He is actually making reference to all of us; all of us whose have been injured by the knocks of life, blinded by all the pride and made weak by our constant falls. We are the ones invited to the Great Banquet, the Feast of the Kingdom of God. We are the ones invited in by God our Father from the highways and by-ways. We are the people who have no hope of repaying His hospitality and the lavish feast he prepares for us. That feast is prepared to celebrate God's constant forgiveness and reconciliation with His children, and He generously serves us with His Son's Body for food and His Blood as the finest wine. We will never be able to respond with an equal invitation.

What we can do, however, is respond in like-kind, in not being limited as to who and when we love, but be willing to give of ourselves to those who in turn will not be able to repay us.

My son, perform your tasks in meekness; then you will be loved by those whom God accepts. The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself; so you will find favour in the sight of the Lord. For great is the might of the Lord; he is glorified by the humble. The affliction of the proud has no healing, for a plant of wickedness has taken root in him. The mind of the intelligent man will ponder a parable, and an attentive ear is the wise man's desire.

Second reading

Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a

'You have come to Mount Sion and to the city of the living God.'

Brothers and Sisters: You have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them.

But you have come to Mount Sion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant.

Gospel Luke 14:1, 7-14

'Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.'One Sabbath, when Jesus went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully.

Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honour, saying to them, 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honour, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, "Give your place to this person", and then you, with shame, will take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher." Then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.'

He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends, or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.'



RIGHT TO LIFE—WRITE TO THE LORDS

The Crime and Policing Bill has passed to the House of Lords for debate. The clause on decriminalising abortion is now Clause 191 of the Crime and Policing Bill. Peers will debate Clause 191 and can suggest changes to it – or even to reject it altogether.

Please write to members of the House of Lords asking them to fight the extreme abortion up to birth amendment. This was not in any manifesto. It was passed after just 43 minutes backbench debate, with very little notice. This online tool Fight the latest attempts to decriminalise abortion - SPUC will generate a Peer at random for you to write to, and give an editable template. Once you have finished your letter, it will be emailed to you to print off and send to the Peer by post. This is an extra step to what you might be used to, but a very necessary one. Paper letters always have more impact than emails, and many Peers do not have publicly available email addresses. Please send the physical letter to Members of the House of Lords (or return them to the office to post for you). Please continue to pray hard. Thank you
