Fr Benjamin writes...

I remember when I was at University the lecturer said, "If you don't have a relationship with someone then that is the nature of your relationship with them. It is, in fact a type of relationship and therefore...a relationship."

Be it close or distant, everything that exists is in relationship to everything else. Our relation to the farthest planet from us in the universe is one of distance. Our relation to our own thoughts is one of intimacy. Everything else is somewhere in between.

There is, then, the other kind of relationship, not between things, but living beings, and within that spectrum, our relations between people; that is between every one of us. We are all linked to one another. If this is so within creation, it is a mere glimmer of the inter-relational communion within God Who is revealed as Triune: One God in Three Persons, Father, Son and Holy Ghost.

We will never be able to understand this Mystery (hence, it being defined as such), and indeed this Theology is expressed in such a way that it is meant to be beyond our grasp because that is something of the reality of God.

Nevertheless, Our Blessed Lord, in a beautiful way reveals yet another dimension of God, which is that He dwells in a loving communion. He speaks of God the Father, of the Holy Spirit and of Himself as being the Son. These are terms we associate with loving and intimate relationships. He is showing us that the reality of God is one, not just of a inter-communal relationships but something far more profound: God is Love. That love is not a private love, but a knowable, but never fully known Gift which when known as love, shines in revelation to us that we are made from love, made for love and made to love God and one another. What a Trinity, what a relationship.

First reading Proverbs 8:22-31

Before the beginning of the earth, Wisdom was brought forth.

Thus says the Wisdom of God: The Lord possessed me at the beginning of his work, the first of his acts of old. Ages ago I was set up, at the first, before the beginning of the earth. When there were no depths I was brought forth, when there were no springs abounding with water. Before the mountains had been shaped, before the hills, I was brought forth, before he had made the earth with its fields, or the first of the dust of the world. When he established the heavens, I was there; when he drew a circle on the face of the deep, when he made firm the skies above, when he established the fountains of the deep, when he assigned to the sea its limit, so that the waters might not transgress his command, when he marked out the foundations of the earth, then I was beside him, like a master workman, and I was daily his delight, rejoicing before him always, rejoicing in his inhabited world and delighting in the children of man.

Euthanasia and Abortion

Whilst it is unlikely there will be time to properly consider the amendments to the Assisted Dying Bill please pray that this Bill does not pass.

Also there are amendments to legalise **abortion up to birth** by decriminalising abortion via the Crime and Policing Bill. This debate is scheduled for 4pm on Tuesday 17th June. If you have not already contacted your MP to oppose these attacks on the sanctity of life, please do so now.

Silent Prayer Re-Trial

During this season of Pentecost and continuing thereafter, please, as a Parish community, pray for the Holy Spirit to guide Adam and his defence lawyers prior to, and during, his re-trial at Bournemouth Crown Court on 28th-30th July. Please pray that the judges and authorities will be receptive to the Truth and that a true conversion to it will be brought about through this case.
