

PARISH OF THE HOLY FAMILY

Fr Benjamin writes ...

I am convinced we spend too little time considering our soul. It is the most precious gift given us by God, but looking at the world, the evidence shows we treat the human soul as an interesting possibility rather than an urgent reality to tend. In Christian philosophy, the word 'soul' is a notoriously sticky thing to define. Essentially it is the unique life given us by God making us who we are, distinct from our body, and which will pass on to the next life when the body dies (later to be reunited with the body at the Final Resurrection, but that's something for another day).

The way we live now affects where we will be for eternity. This is made clear by the sobering parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. The rich man, commonly known as Dives, didn't actually do anything wrong to Lazarus. He did not beat him or abuse him, he did not deny him anything or mistreat him in any way. He did none of these things because he didn't know Lazarus existed, even though he was sitting begging outside his house all those years. The rich man was so caught up in his own life of luxury and pleasure that he had no room in his heart for anyone but himself. He thought only of his own wonts, desires and comfort, but in doing so was blind to all the need around him. He certainly thought nothing of his soul. This is why he ended up suffering in the underworld.

The soul never thrives on selfish behaviour, on solely seeking riches and earthly luxuries. It cannot thrive on this, because it is something from God, and the nature of God is 'to give' rather than 'to have'. We do not know anything about Lazarus' character. All we know is that he ends up in heaven. Perhaps, because of his poverty, he had more room in his heart for others and a greater capacity for empathy and generosity; things by which the soul always gets nurtured.

In the final reckoning, we must contend with the issue that, how we live today, does and will affect our eternal life. There are things which kill the soul, things which always have roots in selfishness. There are graces which always help the soul, graces which always have their root in God and are shown by Christ. Do I live carelessly or carefully? Do I have a care for my immortal soul and the souls of others?

Gospel Luke 16:19-31

'You received good things, and Lazarus bad things; now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish.'

At that time: Jesus said to the Pharisees, 'There was a rich man who was clothed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate was laid a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who desired to be fed with what fell from the rich man's table. Moreover, even the dogs came and licked his sores. The poor man died and was carried by the angels to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried, and in Hades, being in torment, he lifted up his eyes and saw Abraham far off and Lazarus at his side. And he called out, "Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the end of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in anguish in this flame." But Abraham said, "Child, remember that you in your lifetime received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner bad things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in anguish. And besides all this, between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, in order that those who would pass from here to you may not do so, and none may cross from there to us." And he said, "Then I beg you, father, to send him to my father's house — for I have five brothers — so that he may warn them, lest they also come into this place of torment." But Abraham said, "They have Moses and the Prophets; let them hear them." And he said, "No, father Abraham, but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent." He said to him, "If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead."


