# PARISH OF THE HOLY FAMILY

#### Fr Benjamin writes...

It is said that to learn a new language well, with all its idioms euphemisms and idiosyncrasies, you should read a book you know well in that language. I would advise Catholics to read the Bible in their new language, and to also listen to the news.

It is often commented upon that Pentecost is about the gathering of different languages and cultures and that when the apostles spoke, everyone present for the feasts heard them in their own language. This is, in fact a biblical resolution. When humanity decided it wanted to be God, and replace God's rule with their own by building the Tower of Babel (from which we derive the word "babble") God punished the human race by making them speak different languages so that they could not understand one another. Thus divided, they could not rule the world and create themselves as a false god.

The gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost united the newly-born Church, the new Israel, in understanding. Whilst they were hearing the Good News of Jesus Christ in their own tongue, they were, for the first time, in communion through faith and understanding. This gift was given and received, not to become God and build an earthly empire, but to receive God in order to build the Kingdom of heaven on earth.

The earth is indeed rich with a multitude of languages and cultures, but it is not these the Church actually celebrates. What it celebrates is the common baptism in the Holy Spirit that God brings in Christ. It celebrates, one Church, one Faith, one Baptism, not because of the differences that we experience, but in spite of them. The languages themselves are not celebrated, but are used for God's purposes and praise.

As a result of the gift of the Holy Spirit, God has become knowable to all peoples so that they may become one people, the children of God, in order to build His Kingdom. The language we are to learn is, in fact, Christ's language — not Aramaic - but that of His love and mercy, and the determination to worship His heavenly Father as the holy Church on earth.

#### First reading Acts 2:1-11

#### 'They were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak.'

When the day of Pentecost arrived, the Apostles were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one was hearing them speak in his own language. And they were amazed and astonished, saying, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians — we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God.'

Second reading Romans 8:8-17

#### 'For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God.'

Brothers and Sisters: Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. You, however, are not in the flesh but in the Spirit, if in fact the Spirit of God dwells in you. Anyone who does not have the Spirit of Christ does not belong to him. But if Christ is in you, although the body is dead because of sin, the Spirit is life because of righteousness. If the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead dwells in you, he who raised Christ Jesus from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit who dwells in you.

So then, brothers and sisters, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are led by the Spirit of God are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of slavery to fall back into fear, but you have received the Spirit of adoption as sons, by whom we cry, 'Abba! Father!' The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs — heirs of God and fellow heirs with Christ, provided we suffer with him in order that we may also be glorified with him.

At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, 'If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Helper, to be with you for ever. If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words. And the word that you hear is not mine but the Father's who sent me.



On Friday 13th June, the Feast of St Anthony, Parliament will debate amendments to the Euthanasia Bill. Whilst it is unlikely there will be time to properly consider the amendments please pray that this Bill does not pass. Also there are amendments to legalise **abortion up to birth** by decriminalising abortion via the Police and Criminal Justice Bill. If you have not already contacted your MP to oppose these attacks on the sanctity of life, please do so now.
