Fr Benjamin writes ...

The world is an interesting and complex place. Like the vast oceans that it contains, it can swallow us up with all its challenges and intrigue. When we are in rough seas, do we battle the waves and risk being sunk, or do we try to ride them and get through for when times are calmer? That is something of the issue at the heart of today's Gospel.

Many people are often scandalised by the images Our Blessed Lord evokes: of Israel being an unscrupulous steward, and worse, of God being One Who admires and praises trickery. We should not be too scandalised. First of all, these images grab our attention. When the good God is compared to a conniving master our ears are certainly pricked. Then, of course, there is the fact that in other parables Our Blessed Lord frequently compares God and His Kingdom to harsh task masters, hard-hearted judges, and sons who leave their fathers with their inheritance. It's all money and politics. Furthermore, why should He not use such themes? These images depict so many things we can understand and know to be only too real. If we understand them, then rather than fight them, we can learn from them.

The unscrupulous steward is expertly shrewd in all his dealings. Despite being dismissed by his master, he makes sure he wins allies and does it all through dodgy finance, as adeptly as any modern-day trader using the stock market to their advantage. Christians too should be equally adept and expert, not in finance but in the transactions of God. If all the baptised, everywhere and through all ages, put as much energy in following Christ and building His Kingdom on earth as the world puts into trade, making money and often swindling one another, then it would be hugely advanced. Yes, use the zeal of the moneymakers to save souls and the dealings of the politicians to mark your presence in the world says the Lord. Learn from the world, not to become like the world, but so that the world can become Godlier. In this way, we do not so much fight the world, but ride it, and ride it to a place of greater safety: Our Lord Jesus Christ and His heavenly kingdom.

The Lord has sworn by the pride of Jacob: 'Surely I will never forget any of their deeds.'

Second reading

1 Timothy 2:1-8

'Prayers should be made for all people to God, who desires all people to be saved.'

Beloved: First of all, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Saviour, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time.

For this I was appointed a preacher and an Apostle — I am telling the truth, I am not lying — a teacher of the Gentiles in faith and truth. I desire then that in every place the men should pray, lifting holy hands without anger or quarrelling.

Gospel Luke 16:1-13

'You cannot serve God and money.'

At that time: Jesus said to the disciples, 'There was a rich man who had a manager, and charges were brought to him that this man was wasting his possessions. And he called him and said to him, "What is this that I hear about you? Turn in the account of your management, for you can no longer be manager." And the manager said to himself, "What shall I do, since my master is taking the management away from me? I am not strong enough to dig, and I am ashamed to beg. I have decided what to do, so that when I am removed from management, people may receive me into their houses." So, summoning his master's debtors one by one, he said to the first, "How much do you owe my master?" He said, "A hundred measures of oil." He said to him, "Take your bill, and sit down quickly and write fifty." Then he said to another, "And how much do you owe?" He said, "A hundred measures of wheat." He said to him, "Take your bill and write eighty." The master commended the dishonest manager for his shrewdness. For the sons of this world are more shrewd in dealing with their own generation than the sons of light.' And I tell you, make friends for yourselves by means of unrighteous wealth, so that when it fails they may receive you into the eternal dwellings.

'One who is faithful in a very little is also faithful in much, and one who is dishonest in a very little is also dishonest in much. If then you have not been faithful with the unrighteous wealth, who will entrust to you the true riches? And if you have not been faithful with that which is another's, who will give you that which is your own? No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money.'


